Re: Dark Money Spent by Anti-Choice Catholics in Ohio Elections

Top Line: Catholics for Choice – which represents the majority Catholic opinion on abortion — has been able to document at least \$12.4 million of Catholic money poured into the losing Protect Women Ohio campaign opposing Issue 1, according to campaign filings with the Ohio Secretary of State as of 10/18/2023:

- \$2,717,496.59 from Ohio's Catholic bishops and other Catholic-affiliated groups
- \$9,700,000 from the Leonard Leo-linked Concord Fund

That Catholic money represents nearly half (46%) of the <u>total contributions</u> the Protect Women Ohio campaign received (\$26.96 million as of 10/18/2023).

Of the **\$2,717,496.59** (as of 10/18/2023), contributions came from:

- Ohio Catholic dioceses (Cincinnati, Columbus, and Cleveland) donated a combined \$1.7 million
- The Knights of Columbus, a far-right lay fraternal group based in New Haven, CT, gave \$1 million
- 15 Knights of Columbus councils, Catholic parishes, and other Ohio groups gave another \$17,496.59

This amount is far exceeded by the cash poured into the race by the Concord Fund, which according to OpenSecrets.org gave \$16.9 million to "Protect Women Ohio Action, Inc." This Arlington, VA-based group turned around and gave \$9.7 million of that to the Protect Women Ohio campaign (as of 10/18/2023):

• \$2,000,000 in July 2023

• \$3,000,000 in September 2023 • \$4,700,000 in October 2023

According to reporting by <u>Politico</u> and <u>The New York Times</u>, the Concord Fund is an alias of **the Judicial Crisis**Network — part of a shadowy network of right-wing, dark-money groups directed by Catholic judicial activist Leonard Leo that was instrumental in getting Justices Gorsuch, Kavanaugh, and Barrett nominated and confirmed to the U.S. Supreme Court.

Leo, the same ultra-conservative Catholic who engineered the Catholic-dominated Supreme Court that struck down *Roe*, spent millions of dollars trying to stop an abortion rights amendment in Ohio — and lost.

The Catholic hierarchy and their dark-money allies are out of touch, no matter what they say or spend:

- 63% of Catholics think abortion should be legal in all or most cases
- 68% of Catholics did not want to see Roe v. Wade overturned
- <u>1 in 4 abortion patients in the U.S. is Catholic</u>

Catholics for Choice spent a small fraction of the money the bishops spent to combat their disinformation, setting up 47 billboards across the state that told the truth about Catholic support for abortion rights. We also invested in a full-time, Ohio-based field organizer who hosted more than 20 in-person organizing events and distributed thousands of pro-choice Catholic postcards in support of Issue 1.

On Election Day, when 56% of Ohio voters approved Issue 1, it passed with majority support for Issue 1 in the Dioceses of Cincinnati (52%), Cleveland (65.7%), Columbus (59.7%), and Youngstown (56.2%). The votes

of pro-choice Catholics proved essential in the Buckeye State, as they have in every game-changing ballot measure since *Roe* was overturned.

State constitutional amendments are at the forefront of our work to secure abortion rights in a post-*Dobbs* world, but we know that our opposition — a religious force spearheaded by the U.S. Catholic bishops and fueled by dark money — will fight them every step of the way. Catholics for Choice is uniquely positioned to truthfully counter the hierarchy's distortions, and we'll be ready to do just that.
